

What does School-Wide PBS (Positive Behavior Support)

mean?

Our goal is to help each child develop self-discipline. Together the home and school share the responsibility for developing good citizens. Parents, teachers, and students must work together to maintain a safe learning environment. The PBS (Positive Behavior Support) program is based upon recognizing positive contributions of students.

PBS means that teachers, administrators, counselors, and support staff are going to take responsibility to TEACH positive behavior expectations to students.

PBS means that students will know exactly what is expected of them. Students who take responsibility to behave positively will be recognized and rewarded in a variety of ways. Students also know exactly what consequences will result when they choose NOT to meet the school-wide expectations ("all of us will be on the same page").



Student Rewards for Appropriate Behavior

1. Star Student Drawing

Students can be entered in the Star Student drawing through modeling the BI G 3 expectations. Teachers give the students a Star Student nomination ticket that is entered into our weekly drawing. One winner per grade level is announced each Friday. The winners are called to the office to receive their award and get their photo taken for the local newspaper!

2. Bus Bucks

Students riding the bus to and/or from school and who are modeling the BI G 3 expectations can be recognized by their bus driver. Bus drivers will give students Bus Bucks to reward their responsible choices and the Bus Bucks are redeemable at Daniel Boone!

Student Consequences for Inappropriate Behavior

1. **Verbal Warning** – Students will be given a verbal warning regarding the school expectation(s) that was violated. Students will be given the opportunity to correct their behavior before further action is taken.

2. **Minor Behavior Incident** – If the learning of others has not been interrupted, students will be sent to a "safe spot" to reflect on their behavior. If the behavior continues, they will be sent to a "buddy room" for a time out. During this process students will have a chance to discuss better choices they could have made to correct the problem.

3. **Referral to Principal/Assistant Principal**– If the behavior affects the learning of other students or is a major offense, the student will be referred to the office. The principal or assistant principal will determine the appropriate action to resolve the issue.
